The Governing Body is responsible for maintenance of this scheme.

1. Introduction: what a publication scheme is and why it has been developed

One of the aims of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (which is referred to as FOIA in the rest of this document) is that public authorities, including all maintained schools, should be clear and proactive about the information they will make public.

To do this we must produce a publication scheme, setting out:

- The classes of information which we publish or intend to publish;
- The manner in which the information will be published; and
- Whether the information is available free of charge or on payment.

The scheme covers information already published and information which is to be published in the future. All information in our publication scheme is either available for you on our website to download and print off or available in paper form.

Some information which we hold may not be made public, for example personal information.

This publication scheme conforms to the model scheme for schools approved by the Information Commissioner.

2. Aims and Objectives

The school aims to achieved the following:

- For consistently high academic standards
- To deliver the National Curriculum as a minimum entitlement, whilst also offering wider experiences and opportunities
- To address the specific needs of individual children
- To promote equal opportunities for all our children, regardless of gender, race, culture or disadvantage
- To help our children acquire relevant knowledge and skills for a fast changing world
- To teach children to take responsibility for their own actions and to foster respect for others
- To develop an appreciation of beauty and imagination
- To promote Christian values within the school
- To use our financial resources efficiently to create a quality environment and give the highest possible levels of staffing and equipment provision

and this publication scheme is a means of showing how we are pursuing these aims.

3. Categories of Information Published

The publication scheme guides you to information which we currently publish (or have recently published) or which we will publish in the future. This is split into categories of information known as 'classes'. These are contained in section 6 of this scheme. The classes of information that we undertake to make available are organised into four broad topic areas:

Pupils & Curriculum – information about policies that relate to pupils and the school curriculum.

School Policies and other information related to the school - information about policies that relate to the school in general.

Accessibility Plans	Plan for increasing participation of disabled pupils in the school's curriculum, improving the accessibility of the physical environment and improving delivery of information to disabled pupils.
Equality Policy	Statement of policy for promoting race equality
Collective Worship	Statement of arrangements for the required daily act of collective worship
Pupil Behaviour & Discipline	Statement of general principles on behaviour and discipline and of measures taken by the Head Teacher to prevent bullying.
